My dream is for everyone to have joy, love and friends. (Joey)


My dream is for everyone to be able to travel and see how beautiful our world is. (Landon)



songs to sing about reading.




















EES PTO scholarship Franklin County Technical School

Scholarship Opportunities


Erving Teachers' Association Erving PTO


