


### Car Seat and Booster Seat Safety


Thank you to Deputy Fire Chief Leon Ambo and Firefighter Luke Harnett from the Turners Falls Fire Dept. for coming on Monday and talking with parents about how to properly install a child safety seat and the changes in the guidelines for when to move a child into the next stage of car seat. These two firefighters are certified car seat technicians. If you have any questions about how your car seat is installed or when you should move your child to the next stage of car seat, you can call the Turners Fire Dept. at (413) 863-9023 and make an appointment to have your seat inspected at the station.

"The Amazing Learners" in 2nd grade are working with beginning concepts of multiplication! We have explored "groups" or "sets" as a way of introducing ourselves to repeated addition in order to compute a total. These mathematical constructions serve as an important foundation to concepts that grow more complex in later years of mathematical understandings. The more they share their "math chat" with one another, the more they are discovering connections with math facts and ideas they already knew! Way to go second graders!










It may surprise you to learn that motor vehicle crashes are a leading cause of death for children under 14. In fact, even a sudden stop can lead to serious injuries. That's why it's essential that your child ride in the right car seat at all times.

According to the National Highway Traffic Safety Administration (NHTSA), your child should stay in the safest car seat type – rearfacing, forward-facing, and booster seats – for as long as they meet the manufacturer's height and weight requirements. There's no need to rush them to the next car seat type.

### **Car Seat Options**



- Massachusetts law requires that all children riding in passenger motor vehicles be in a federally approved car or booster seat that is properly fastened and secured according to the manufacturer's instructions until they are 8 years old or over 57 inches tall. When children outgrow their booster seat, they are required to wear a seat belt.
- The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends a rear-facing car seat until 2 years of age or until your child reaches the highest height and weight allowed by the car seat manufacturer.
- The back seat is the safest place for your child. The American Academy of Pediatrics recommends children ages 12 and under ride in the back seat.

### Proper installation



A properly installed car seat can save your child's life. Review your child's car seat and vehicle manufacturer's installation instructions. If you need assistance:

- Click on the Inspection Site Locator at mass.gov/ carseats to find car seat inspection sites across MA with staff who can install your car seat or inspect a seat already installed to ensure it's been done correctly.
- Call the MA Child Passenger Safety (CPS) Information Line at 877-392-5956.

### Important CPS tips

- Check the car seat manual for height and weight limits to make sure you have the right car seat.
- Check the date of manufacture on the car seat label or in the manual to make sure that it is not expired.
- The car seat should not move side-to-side or frontto-back more than 1 inch at the belt path once it is installed using either seat belt or lower anchors.
- Make sure the chest clip is at armpit level and harness straps are secured on shoulders.
- Do the pinch test: Pinch the harness straps vertically at the collarbone. If you can grab excess slack between your fingers and pinch it, the straps are too loose.
- Use a top tether when installing the car seat in the forward-facing mode.
- Use a trunk or cargo area to properly store loose items. Loose objects can become projectiles in a crash.
- Set a good example. Wear your seat belt!
   Massachusetts law requires everyone to buckle up.
