


This new group of first graders couldn't be any more excited to be together! They've given their all during each and every activity, and are




learning all the new responsibilities that come with being in first grade. In our first week together we have read stories, explored

As the Food Service Director for the Erving Elementary School my job is to ensure that our children are getting the best nutrition we can give them.

The USDA has issued new standards and some of them are much different than what we are accustomed to. For example:

- 1) We can no longer offer flavored milk to our 3 year-old students, therefore all Preschoolers will have the option of skim milk or 1% milk at all meals.
- 2) All cereal must have 6g or less sugar per 1 oz. of dry cereal. The following will be offered to all students starting the week of September 10th, Cinnamon Chex, Rice Chex, reduced sugar Cinnamon Toast Crunch & 1 more to be determined.
- 3) For Preschool students only, there will no longer be a sun butter & jelly option. With these changes in mind, I have updated our menu for PreK Kindergarten.

On the staffing side, we welcome Deb Porlier to our cafeteria team. Deb is an amazing baker with a lot of experience working in schools. She will be providing our students with fresh baked, whole grain breakfast & lunch items. We are very excited to have Deb on board. She will be creating new items for our students to enjoy. There will be sample days when new entrées are being offered.

The Erving Cafeteria has teamed up with local farmers in order to provide our students with fresh fruits and vegetables throughout the year. So far, we have reached an agreement with two local companies, Clarkdale's & Dan's Veggies. We will be adding to our farm list in the coming weeks. As you know, locally sourced produce is seasonal; therefore our offerings will change on a regular basis. Please stay tuned for our Local Maple Syrup days

provided to us by Poplar Mountain Maple located here in Erving.

The Cafeteria is excited about all of the changes being made and we appreciate the support of our community. Please stop by and visit us soon!




